# Revelation 14:1-5 sermon study

### Intro:

not only do we constantly fail in the Christian life - the world is constantly reminding us of it

### Problem:

Satan can seem to be winning - Rev 13:5-10 but He is not - John 16:33

### Context

rev 14 contrasts chapter 13 to emphasize this very fact for our encouragement using the 144k as our example

#### Main Idea:

Can you see their victory Can you hear their song Can you claim their holiness

## Implication:

we are already victors - Eph 2:6 we are already singing - Eph 5:18-20 we are already holy - Eph 1:4; 5:25-27

## Application:

we can feel the opposite of victorious when we blow it - Rom 7:14-24 But thats because it is not about our victory but His - Rom 8:1, 28-39

## Action:

be encouraged

we hold the treasure of our redemption in jars of clay - 2 Cor 4:1-11 we may be cracked and broken but that doesn't mean we are not victorious

Text.

## Can you see their victory

Rev. 14:1 ¶ Then I looked, and behold, on Mount Zion stood the Lamb, and with him **144,000** who had **his** name and **his Father's name** written on their **foreheads**.

#### Mt Zion

- Rev 11:7-8 (used to be Sodom and Egypt)
- Ps 2 (now a symbol of victory)

### 14400

- Rev 7 (Jewish evangelists)

### name on foreheads

- Rev 13:16-18

### Can you see their victory

- Heb 12:18-24 (we are already at Zion)

# Can you hear their song

Rev. 14:2 And **I heard a voice** from heaven like the roar of many waters and like the **sound** of loud thunder. The **voice** I heard was like the **sound** of harpists playing on their harps,

Rev. 14:3 and they were **singing a new song** before the throne and before the four living creatures and before the elders. **No one could learn that song except** the 144,000 who had been **redeemed** from the earth.

## a voice

- Rev 1:15

# new song no one could learn except

- Rev 5:8-14

# Can you hear their song?

- John 10:1-30 (we have already learned the song)

# Can you claim their holiness

Rev. 14:4 It is these who have not defiled themselves with women, for they are virgins (only ref to masculine in Bible). It is these who follow the Lamb wherever he goes. These have been redeemed from mankind as firstfruits for God and the Lamb,

Rev. 14:5 and in their mouth no lie was found, for they are blameless.

# these who have not defiled/those who follow

- Rev 14:8 (unique masc. virgin - spiritual adultery)

#### Redeemed

- Hosea 1:1-3, 2:2, 5, 7-8, 13; 3:1-5 (redeemed)

### *firstfruits*

- Rom 11:15-16, 25-27 (made firstfruit)

## no lie in mouth

- Isa 29:13 -> Zeph 3:11-13 (made faithful)

### blameless

- (Lev 11:45 made holy)

# Can you claim their holiness

- Col 1:21-22 (we are already made blameless)

## Implication:

- Eph 2:6 (we are already victors)
- Eph 5:18-20 (we are already singing)
- Eph 1:4; 5:25-27 (already holy)
