A Deliberate Disappointment

1. Sin survived

Gen. 9:18 ¶ The sons of Noah who went forth from the ark were Shem, Ham, and Japheth. (Ham was **the father of Canaan**.)

Gen. 9:19 These three were the sons of Noah, and from these the people of the whole earth were **dispersed**.

dispersed

- Matt 12:43-45; Rev 20:1-8 (dont put your hope in a fresh start)
- 2 Cor 5:16-17 (Every beginning but one will betray you)

2. Sin still thrives

Gen. 9:20 ¶ Noah began to be a man of the soil, and he planted a vineyard.

Gen. 9:21 He drank of the wine and became **drunk** and lay uncovered in his tent.

drunk

- 2 Sam 12:1-9; Matt 16:13-23 (Dont put your hope in a fallible hero)

- Jn 2:1-11 (every leader but one will let you down)

3. Sinners collide

Gen. 9:22 And Ham, **the father of Canaan**, saw the nakedness of his father and told his two brothers outside. Gen. 9:23 Then Shem (israel) and Japheth (gentiles) took a garment, laid it on both their shoulders, and walked backward and **covered** (*piel*) the nakedness of their father. Their faces were turned backward, and they did not see their father's nakedness.

Gen. 9:24 When Noah awoke from his wine and knew what his youngest son had done to him, Gen. 9:25 he said,

"Cursed (be) Canaan;

a servant of servants shall he be to his

brothers."

Gen. 9:26 ¶ He also said,

"Blessed be the Lord, the **God of Shem**; and let **Canaan** be his servant.

Gen. 9:27 May God enlarge Japheth,

and let him dwell in the tents of Shem, and let Canaan be his servant."

covered (piel)

- Gen 3:7, 21 (a godly trait)
- 1 Cor 13:6 (the delight of Ham is opposite)

Canaan cursed

Lev 18:1-25 (Ham a picture of Canaan)

God of Shem

2 Kings 17:19-20; (Dont put your hope in a fallen community)

- mk 3:31-35; jn 7:5; mk 10:29-30; Lk 14:26

(every family but one will frustrate you)

4. Noah died

Gen. 9:28 ¶ After the flood Noah lived 350 years. Gen. 9:29 All the days of Noah were 950 years, and he **died**.

died

- Jn 8:51-58 (Dont put your hope in a fleeting life) (every life but one will end)

A Deliberate Disappointment

intro:

we often think the bible as a book of morality lessons its not - it is a book of failure and true fulfillment - video

Problem:

1 cor 10:6-14 (idolatry - the things we think we stand in) our idols are shown repeatedly to fail the bible is deliberate about disappointing us for a profoundly positive reason...that we might see Christ

Genesis 9:18-29 shows us that after the flood, after the ark, after the rainbow

Main Idea:

sin survived sin still thrived sinners still collide Noah still died

Implication:

Every beginning but one will betray you every leader but one will let you down every family but one will frustrate you every life but one will end

Application:

1 Pet 1:3-5 we were born again to a living hope - what does this mean?

1 Pet 1:13 set your hope fully on grace...

1 Pet 1:14 not on your former ignorance...and futile ways (1:18)

don't put your hope in a fresh start don't put your hope in a fallible hero don't put your hope in a fallen community don't put your hope in a fleeting life

The Bible is full of deliberate disappointments until...

God raised and glorified Christ - so our hope would be IN Him (1:21)
