What will it profit you to gain the world

Gen. 19:1 ¶ The two angels came to Sodom in the evening, and **Lot was sitting in the gate of Sodom**. When Lot saw them, he rose to meet them and bowed himself with his face to the earth

Gen. 19:2 and said, "My lords, please turn aside to your servant's house and spend the night and wash your feet. Then you may rise up early and go on your way." They said, "No; we will spend the night in the town square."

Gen. 19:3 But he pressed them strongly; so they turned aside to him and entered his house. And he made them a feast and baked unleavened bread (contrast Abraham), and they ate.

Gen 13:1-13 (live near sin) Gen 14:12 (living in sin) Gen 19:1 (thriving in sin)

and lose your voice

Gen. 19:4 ¶ But before they lay down, the men of the city, the men of Sodom, both young and old, **all the people to the last man**, surrounded the house.

Gen. 19:5 And they called to Lot, "Where are the men who came to you tonight? Bring them out to us, that we may know them."

Gen. 19:6 Lot went out to the men at the entrance, shut the door after

Gen. 19:7 and said, "I beg you, my brothers, do not act so wickedly.

Gen. 19:8 Behold, I have two daughters who have not known any

man. Let me bring them out to you, and do to them as you please. Only do nothing to these men, for they have come under the shelter of my roof "

Gen. 19:9 But they said, "Stand back!" And they said, "This fellow came to sojourn, and **he has become the judge!** Now we will deal worse with you than with them." Then they pressed hard against the man Lot, and drew near to break the door down.

Gen. 19:10 But the men reached out their hands and brought Lot into the house with them and shut the door.

Gen. 19:11 And they struck with blindness the men who were at the entrance of the house, both small and great, so that they wore themselves out groping for the door.

Gen 6.5 (same as the flood) Gen 18:20 (a great outcry) Jude 7 (an example for us) Rom 1:18-32 (a cultural crisis point)

he has become the judge

Rom 2:1-5 (powerless -Lot was only relatively better 19:8) Acts 5:1-14 (contrast)

your impact

Gen. 19:12 ¶ Then the men said to Lot, "Have you anyone else here? Sons-in-law, sons, daughters, or anyone you have in the city, bring them out of the place.

Gen. 19:13 For we are about to destroy this place, because the outcry against its people has become great before the LORD, and the LORD has sent us to destroy it."

Gen. 19:14 So Lot went out and said to his sons-in-law, who were to marry his daughters, "Up! Get out of this place, for the LORD is about to destroy the city." **But he seemed to his sons-in-law to be jesting**.

2 Pet 2:6-8 (righteous Lot?) 1 Cor 3:10-15 (saved through fire)

your purpose

Gen. 19:15 ¶ As morning dawned, the angels urged Lot, saying, "Up! Take your wife and your two daughters who are here, lest you be swept away in the punishment of the city."

Gen. 19:16 **But he lingered**. So the men seized him and his wife and his two daughters by the hand, the LORD being merciful to him, and they brought him out and set him outside the city.

Gen. 19:17 And as they brought them out, one said, "Escape for your life. Do not look back or stop anywhere in the valley. Escape to the hills, lest you be swept away."

Gen. 19:18 And Lot said to them, "Oh, no, my lords.

Gen. 19:19 Behold, your servant has found favor in your sight, and you have shown me great kindness in saving my life. But I cannot escape to the hills, lest the disaster overtake me and I die.

Gen. 19:20 Behold, this city is near enough to flee to, and it is a little one. Let me escape there—is it not a little one?—and my life will be saved!" Gen. 19:21 He said to him, "Behold, I grant you this favor also, that I will not overthrow the city of which you have spoken.

Gen. 19:22 Escape there quickly, for I can do nothing till you arrive there." Therefore the name of the city was called Zoar.

Gen. 19:23 ¶ The sun had risen on the earth when Lot came to Zoar. Gen. 19:24 Then the LORD rained on Sodom and Gomorrah sulfur and fire from the LORD out of heaven.

Gen. 19:25 And he overthrew those cities, and all the valley, and all the inhabitants of the cities, and what grew on the ground.

Gen. 19:26 But Lot's wife, behind him, looked back, and she

became a pillar of salt.

pillar of salt Luke 17:28-33 (a pillar of salt outside the city)

but he lingered

Matt 5:11-16 (Lot was useless)

vour hope

Gen. 19:27 ¶ And Abraham went early in the morning to the place where he had stood before the LORD.

Gen. 19:28 And he looked down toward Sodom and Gomorrah and toward all the land of the valley, and he looked and, behold, the smoke of the land went up like the smoke of a furnace.

Gen. 19:29 \P So it was that, when God destroyed the cities of the valley,

God remembered Abraham and sent Lot out of the midst of the overthrow when he overthrew the cities in which Lot had lived Gen. 19:30 ¶ Now Lot went up out of Zoar and lived in the hills with his two daughters, for he was afraid to live in Zoar. So he lived in a cave with his two daughters.

Gen. 19:31 And the firstborn said to the younger, "Our father is old, and there is not a man on earth to come in to us after the manner of all the earth.

Gen. 19:32 Come, let us make our father drink wine, and we will lie with him, that we may preserve offspring from our father."

Gen. 19:33 So they made their father drink wine that night. And the firstborn went in and lay with her father. He did not know when she lay down or when she arose.

Gen. 19:34 ¶ The next day, the firstborn said to the younger, "Behold, I lay last night with my father. Let us make him drink wine tonight also. Then you go in and lie with him, that we may preserve offspring from our father."

Gen. 19:35 So they made their father drink wine that night also. And the younger arose and lay with him, and he did not know when she lay down or when she arose.

Gen. 19:36 Thus both the daughters of Lot became pregnant by their father. (reap what you sow 19:8)

Gen. 19:37 The firstborn bore a son and called his name Moab (from our father). He is the father of the **Moabites** to this day.

Gen. 19:38 The younger also bore a son and called his name Ben-ammi (from my kinsman). He is the father of the **Ammonites** to this day.

Problem:

James 4:4

friendship with the world defines you as an enemy of God Abraham's friendship with God in Genesis 18 is in direct and terrifying contrast with Lot's friendship with the world in Genesis 19

Luke 9:23-25 and the lesson is clear

Main Idea:

what will it profit you to gain the world and lose your voice your impact your purpose your hope

Implication:

Its easy to read (romans 1:18-32) and see only others until you get to Rom 3:9-18 - and see yourself can you hear the quietness of your voice can you see the weakness of your impact can you recognize the diluting of your purpose can you feel the flimsiness of your hope

Application:

but the story doesn't end there - Ruth 1:4; 4:13-22 (david)

Christmas came - Matt 1:1-5

even for Sodom - Rom 5:6-11

we may live in Sodom but Sodom doesn't need to live in us

we are called to be the salt of sodom so that even in this darkness His star still shines
