The fallen will of Man

Gen. 50:15 ¶ When Joseph's brothers saw that their father was dead, they said, "It may be that Joseph will hate us and pay us back for all the evil that we did to him."

Gen. 50:16 So they sent a message to Joseph, saying, "Your father gave this command before he died: Gen. 50:17 'Say to Joseph, "Please forgive the transgression of your brothers and their sin, because **they did evil** to you.'" And now, please forgive the transgression of the servants of the God of your father."

Joseph wept when they spoke to him.

Gen. 50:18 His brothers also came and fell down before him and said, "Behold, we are your servants."

Matt 7:15-20 (<u>libertarian free will is false</u> - free will defined) Eph 2:1-3 (we are free limited by our nature) Rom 7:24-8:2 (saved from our fallen will) Rom 6:5-23 (possess tow natures) 1 john 3:9 (limited by our new nature) James 1:13-14 (God and man both limited but free - fatalism false) Gen 37:5-11 (yet thankfully...<u>open theism is false</u>- God is still in control)

Is compatible with the Sovereign will of God

Gen. 50:19 But Joseph said to them, "**Do not fear**, for am I in the place of God? Gen. 50:20 As for you, you meant evil against me, **but God meant it for good**, to bring it about that many people should be kept alive, as they are today.

gen 45:5-8 (Compatibilism God meant -wanted, planned- good - opposite what we did yet...) Acts 7:9 (but God - His sovereign will is compatible with Man's fallen will) Ex 4:21 -> 8:15 (compatible with Pharaoh) 2 sam 24:1 -> 1 Chron 21:1 (compatible with satan) Acts 2:23 (The free and fallen will of man is compatible with the free and sovereign will of God to accomplish the sovereign purpose of God...

For our good

Gen. 50:21 **So do not fear**; I will provide for you and your little ones." **Thus he comforted them** and spoke kindly to them.

Rom 8:28-32 (for our good) 1 Jn 4:16-19 (comfort in His love - His perfect/complete, sovereign love - not ours)

And His glory

Rev 14:6-7 (everlasting gospel- you will never understand God's grace until you understand it was in motion before you were born) Rev 13:8 (is not plan B-> it was the force of sovereign grace

that brought Joseph into Egypt, into slavery, into royalty Israel into provision Jesus to a cross you to this moment
