Intro:

Rom 1:16-17 Is the gospel really the power of God for salvation for Jews

Problem:

Rom 9:1-5; 10:1-3; 11:1a Has God rejected the nation of Israel? Has He replaced Her? Will He reject or replace us? How can we trust the unblushing promises of the Gospel in light of Israel's current condition?

Rom 9 establishes God's sovereignty in electing Israel Rom 10 establishes Israel's responsibility in rejecting Him Rom 11 but Romans 11 is the answer.

Israel's future as the ultimate vindication of the Gospel.

In my estimation, there is no passage of Scripture that articulates God's absolute trustworthiness and faithfulness better than Romans 11

And it absolutely matters because it is this trustworthiness that is the basis of our day to day walk of faith

Main Idea:

God has not rejected Israel God has not replaced Israel The Gospel of God is really true Rejoice in the One who is wiser than you

Romans 8:28 is really true

Rejoice in the God who is wiser than you

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Text:

God has not rejected Israel

Rom. 11:1 ¶ I ask, then, has God rejected his people? By no means! For I myself am an Israelite, a descendant of Abraham, a member of the tribe of Beniamin.

Rom. 11:2 God has not rejected his people whom he foreknew (Israel is the only nation He foreknew). Do you not know what the Scripture says of Elijah, how he appeals to God against Israel?

Rom. 11:3 "Lord, they have killed your prophets, they have demolished your altars, and I alone am left, and they seek my life."

Rom. 11:4 But what is God's reply to him? "I have kept for myself seven thousand men who have not bowed the knee to Baal."

Rom. 11:5 So too at the present time there is a remnant, chosen by grace.

Rom. 11:6 But if (since) it is by grace, it is no longer on the basis of works; otherwise grace would no longer be grace.

Rom. 11:7 ¶ What then? Israel failed to obtain what it was seeking. The elect obtained it, but the rest were hardened,

Bom, 11:8 as it is written.

"God gave them a spirit of stupor, (quotes from the prophets Isa 29:10)

- eyes that would not see (quotes from the Law deut 29:4)
- and ears that would not hear,
- down to this very day."

Rom. 11:9 ¶ And David says, (quotes from the writings Ps 69:22-23)

"Let their table become a snare and a trap, a stumbling block and a retribution for them;

Rom. 11:10

- let their eyes be darkened so that they cannot see, and bend their backs forever."
- and being uner backs interver. 1 Kings 19:10-18 (God has not rejected Israel not all Israel is true) Gen 45:6-7 (Has always been about a remnant chosen by grace alone despite rejection and unbelief- always will 144k in rev 14)
- Gen 6:5-8 (always been the picture of Man)

(Men seem to think that God is under obligation to grant salvation to guilty men; that if he saves one he must save all. They talk about rights, as if any man had any right before the throne of God, except the right to be punished for his sin. Spurgeon)

- Luke 23:32-33 (still is - one thief was saved that no sinner might despair, but only one that no sinner might presume J.C. Ryle,

God has not replaced Israel

Rom. 11:11 ¶ So I ask, did they stumble in order that they might fall? By no means! Rather, through their trespass salvation has come to the Gentiles, so as to make Israel jealous

Rom. 11:12 Now if (since) their trespass means riches for the world, and if their failure means riches for the Gentiles, how much more will their full inclusion mean

Rom. 11:13 ¶ Now I am speaking to you Gentiles. Inasmuch then as I am an apostle to the Gentiles, I magnify my ministry

Rom. 11:14 in order somehow to make my fellow Jews jealous, and thus save some of them.

Rom. 11:15 For if (since) their rejection means the reconciliation of the world, what will their acceptance mean but life from the dead?

Rom. 11:16 If (since) the dough offered as firstfruits is holy, so is the whole lump, and if the root is holy, so are the branches.

Rom. 11:17 ¶ But if (since) some of the branches were broken off, and you, although a wild olive shoot, were grafted in among the others and now share in the nourishing root of the olive tree,

Rom. 11:18 do not be arrogant toward the branches. If (since) you are, remember it is not you who support the root, but the root that supports you.

Rom. 11:19 Then you will say, "Branches were broken off so that I might be grafted in."

Rom. 11:20 That is true. They were broken off because of their unbelief, but you stand fast through faith. So do not become proud, but fear.

Rom. 11:21 For if (since) God did not spare the natural branches, neither will he spare you.

Rom. 11:22 Note then the kindness and the severity of God: severity toward those who have fallen, but God's kindness to you, provided you continue in his kindness. Otherwise you too will be cut off.

Rom. 11:23 And even they, if (3rd class) they do not continue in their unbelief, will be grafted in, for God has the power to graft them in again.

Rom. 11:24 For if (since) you were cut from what is by nature a wild olive tree, and grafted, contrary to nature, into a cultivated olive tree, how much more will these, the natural branches, be grafted back into their own olive tree.

Rom. 11:25 ¶ Lest you be wise in your own sight, I do not want you to be unaware of this mystery, brothers: a partial hardening has come upon Israel, until the fullness of the Gentiles has come in.

Rom. 11:26 And in this way all Israel will be saved, as it is written,

"The Deliverer will come from Zion,

he will banish ungodliness from Jacob";

"and this will be my covenant with them

when I take away their sins."

- eph 3:1-10. Col 1.24-29.

Rom 16:25-27 (God has not replaced Israel but He is doing something new) - deut 9:1-7 (the church is not more righteous than Israel (Rev 2-3)—do not reject her in your worldview) - Isa 59:16-21 (this is not spiritualizing the cross)

- Zech 12:1-10; 13:1-2; 14:1-11, 16-21 (until...that day)

The Gospel of God is really true

Rom. 11:27

Rom. 11:28 ¶ As regards the gospel, they are enemies for your sake. But as regards election, they are beloved for the sake of their forefathers. Rom. 11:29 For the gifts and the calling of God are irrevocable.

Rom. 11:30 For just as you were at one time disobedient to God but now have received mercy because of their disobedience,

Rom. 11:31 so they too have now been disobedient in order that by the mercy shown to you they also may now receive mercy.

- Rom. 11:32 For God has consigned all to disobedience, that he may have mercy on all. ps 89:31-37 (if God will keep His promises to unfaithful unbelieving Israel) 1 Cor 1:4-9 (if He will keep His promises to the divisive immature Corinthians he will keep His promises to you

 - 2 Pet 1:3-4 (His promises are how we will live the Christian life)

Rejoice in the One who is wiser than you

Rom. 11:33 ¶ Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are his judgments and how inscrutable his ways! Rom. 11:34 ¶ "For who has known the mind of the Lord,

or who has been his counselor?'

Bom 11:35 "Or who has given a gift to him

that he might be repaid?'

Rom. 11:36 ¶ For from him and through him and to him are all things. To him be glory forever. Amen.
