-Read 1 Corinthians 2:1-5 for the answer.

-Read: 2 Corinthians 11:1-6, 12-15.

-Based on this passage and the reviews above why is our perception and the intent and even encouragement of a teacher not the issue?

- -Our problem is that we are an undiscerning generation, we do not know how nor do we even try to spot fakes and frauds
- -Matthew is concerned in 22:15-46 to show not only that Christ is validated by the Scriptures but that those who challenged Him were invalidated by them.

### -Here is the Main Idea of the sermon:

The Word of God is the standard by which truth is declared and error exposed - it alone is our authority for faith and practice.

## Text:

## Entangled by Scripture (Matthew 22:15-22)

-Read: Job 12:23; Daniel 2:20-23; Proverbs 21:1and Romans 13:1-7.

-Based on these verses why would Jesus call the Pharisees hypocrites?

-When saying render the things unto God that are God's...

-Read Genesis 1:26-27; James 3:8-9 and Psalm 51.

-How does Romans 12:1-2 illustrate "rendering to God the things that are His?"

# Ridiculed by Scripture (Matthew 22:23-33)

-In verse 24 the Sadducces refer to the Scriptures as Moses' words. How does Jesus escalate commitment to the Word in verse 31, whose words are they?

-in verse 29 and 31 Jesus shows that their real problem is that they do not believe the Scriptures (Luke 19:19-31 colors this in). Jesus uses the present tense of the state of being verb "I Am" in Exodus 3:6 to prove based on the verbal inspiration of the Scripture that there is indeed a resurrection.

-Read: 2 Corinthians 10:3-5; Ephesians 6:15.

-what was Jesus doing with the Word?

-Read: Matthew 4:1-11 for another example of Jesus using the sword of the Spirit in spiritual warfare.
-If Jesus used the Word of God as His authority how

much more ought we to do the same?

## Tested by Scripture (Matthew 22:34-40)

- -Based on these verses, why did the Pharisees ask Jesus about which commandment was greatest?
- -Jesus quoted from Deuteronomy 6:4-9.
  - -what were the Pharisees likely wearing on their foreheads as they asked him this question?
  - -In deuteronomy 6:16 what is the best way to break the command in 6:5? -Read:exodus 17:1-7.
    - -how did they put God to the test? What exactly were they doubting?
    - -Read Matthew 4:7. Jesus refers to this event when Satan was putting God's provision to the test.
      - -what were the Pharisees doing that very moment?
- -Jesus quoted the second half of Leviticus 19:17-18.
  - -what was the first half?
    - -what were they doing to Christ that very moment?
- -Read: Hebrews 4:12-13.
  - -what was the Scripture doing to them?

# Silenced by Scripture (Matthew 22:41-46)

- -Jesus asks them who they think the Christ will be. Read Isaiah 9:7; 11:1, 10; Psalm 2; 89; 132; Jeremiah 23:5.
  - -Who has matthew shown Jesus to be?
    - -To find out, read: Matthew 1:1,20: 9:27; 15:22; 20:30; 21:9, 15; 12:23
- -Jesus challenges them with the implications of Psalm 110. Read it and notice His use of it in Matthew 26:63-65. It seems that the Pharisees knew what He was asking but refused to even acknowledge Him even still. They were truly exposed by the Scripture.

#### Here are the implications for us today:

The Word is, and always has been the standard - Jeremiah 23:9-22

it has been made more sure for us - 2 Peter 1:16-21; Luke 24:25-27

it has been completed - Jude 3

it is all we need to know - 2 Timothy 3:14-16

it is the standard of God's approval - 2 Timothy 2:15-16

it is authoritative - Titus 2:15

## Here is how we need to apply this:

Use it as our authority - Acts 17:2-3, 11

Use it as our measuring rod - Acts 20:17-32
