Death = alienation/separation not cessation the problem is that we are separated... (Genesis 3:1-24) from the creator - 3:8-12 from creation - 3:17-19 from the flesh - 3:22-24 from others - 3:12, 16

CPT:

The Wrath of Man (Matthew 27:27-44)

- -Read verse 34 and then read Psalm 69 to get a picture of Christ's thoughts in this moment
 - -based on this psalm, what was Christ likely thinking during these moments on the cross?

-What was He asking the Father for?

The Wrath of God (Matthew 27:45-50)

-here we see the wrath of God on display - specifically verse 46. Read psalm 22, written four centuries before crucifixion was invented, to see what the wrath of God looks like towards God.

-what was Christ denied that He was clearly asking for in psalm 69?

-Jesus cried out to God, not His Father here. He was forsaken so we would never have to be.

Reconciliation (Matthew 27:51-54)

-based on, Colossians 1:15-18, what was God reconciling to Himself here? -Matthew points out four areas specifically that were reconciled through this event. -27:51 points to Hebrews 10:19-22, reconciliation to the Father

-27:51 points to Romans 8:18-25, reconciliation to the Creation

-27:52 points to 1 Corinthians 15:20-23, reconciliation to the flesh

-27:51, 54, points to Ephesians 2:11-16, reconciliation to others
