## Problem:

-Read Matthew 20:17-28

-Notice that the problem is not the desire for greatness.

-Whatever we do, let us not criticize the disciples in their desire for greatness. Their dreams of greatness were foolish and immature but they were not wrong. Christ

did not criticize their desire, He showed them the right path to its fulfillment.

In other words, It is not wrong to desire greatness it is wrong to not know what

greatness is or how it is won. Knowing what greatness is allows you to pursue everything you have got.

it with everything -Read: 1 Cor 9:24-27.

-How does Paul's illustration here prove this point?

## <u>Text</u>:

Becoming the last (Matthew 20:17-19)

-Read Matthew 19:30 and 20:16. The context is about status in the Kingdom being different than statues here and now. Jesus then describes His journey towards being last. -Read Luke 9:51; Isaiah 50:6-7.

-How do these verses color this passage regarding the journey towards Jerusalem? -What did Jesus understand that these did not?

-Read Isaiah 9:2-7 and 52:13-53:12.

-How does this reflect on the title: Son of Man?

- -How does this designation make His journey towards Jerusalem and the cross that much more shocking?
- -Why were the disciples not more shocked by this prediction?

# ...So about that crown? (Matthew 20:20-21)

-Matthew had redacted His death two times previous to this (Matthew 16:21 and 17:22-23). -Based on their concern here what was their focus in the midst of these predictions?

-Read Matthew 19:27-29 for the answer.

-How does this reflect your thinking as well?

#### You do not know what you are asking (Matthew 20:22-23)

-When Jesus replies He does so in the plural "you," where earlier in verse 21 he used the singular, why?

-Read Mark 10:35 to find out.

-Our whole passage is summed up in Luke 18:34. How does this sum up what is going on? -Read: Matthew 26:39, 42 and Isaiah 51:17.

-What was the cup that Jesus was referring to?

-Read: Acts 12:2 and Revelation 1:9.

-How did James and John drink the cup as well?

-Read Matthew 27:38. Compare this with their request. How does this reflect on our passage?

-Read Luke 23:39-43. How does this illustrate last week's message (Matthew 19:30-20:16)?

#### Greatness comes through service and slavery (Matthew 20:24-28)

-Jesus again uses the Son of Man title for Himself in reference to His coming to serve. -Read: Daniel 7:13-14. Based ion this text what is ironic about this?

-Read: Galatians 3:13 and 2 Corinthians 5:21. Based on these verses how did Jesus serve us in the act of redemption?

-Read: Matthew 16:24-27; 18:1-4; 23:11. Do you think the disciples eventually got it?

Read: Revelation 1:1; James 1:1; 2 Peter 1:1; Jude 1; Philippians 1:1. The words used is in every case the word for slave.

# Main Idea:

Greatness is not won wearing a crown of gold, it is won wearing a crown of thorns.

#### Implication:

So what does greatness look like? -Read: Acts 6:1-6 -Who was stephan? -What was his role? -Read: Acts 7:51-60 -What does slavery for the cause of God look like? -How does Jesus standing reflect sporting events? -How does this help to define greatness?

Stephan may motivate us but what motivated him? -Read: Hebrews 12:1-2 -who is our ultimate example? -How does our text inspire us to greatness? Read: Philippians 2:1-11. -How does this text encapsulate everything discussed so far? -What is the practical application of all of this?

let us strive to do more than serve- let us strive to BE servants and to BE slaves of the cause of Christ.
