Problem:

the problem of a fallen nature -Luke 6:43-45

many evangelicals believe that saving faith can arise out of our fallen natures - but Scripture plainly teaches otherwise.

Ephesians 2:1-8 (both grace and faith = feminine but the that is neuter referring to the phrase) your faith is a gift from God -it is not the price of redemption but the mechanism of redemption wrought by the Holy Spirit

in other words - regeneration precedes faith or faith is a gift

Text:

Darkness had come and Jesus had not yet come to them

John 6:16 ¶ When evening came, **his disciples** went down to the sea, John 6:17 got into a boat, and started across (were going) the sea to Capernaum. (Galilean Bethesaida a suburb- Mk 6:45) It was now dark (darkness had already come), and Jesus had not yet come to them.

Darkness- Jn 3:2; 8:12; 9:2-5; 11:8-10; 12:35-37; 13:30; 19:38-39; 20:1; 21:3-4 we cannot see God - Jn 1:1-18; 3:3 and we don't want to see God - Jn 3:19-21; 9:37-41

They see Jesus walking on the sea

John 6:18 The sea became rough because a strong wind was blowing. John 6:19 When they had rowed about three or four miles, they saw (they see- dramatic present) Jesus walking on the sea and coming near the boat, and they (became) were frightened.

walking on water -

mark 6:52- linked with the loaves Jn 5:45-46; 6:28-32- linked with moses exodus 14:19-31 linked with exodus 1 Cor 10:1-11 - real typology -new exodus from unbelief

Fear not, I AM

John 6:20 But he said to them, "It is I (ego eime); do not be afraid."

Fear not I Am- becomes a commissioning - exodus 3:1-15; Isaiah 6:1-8; 43:1-13; 51:9-16 - from fear to commissioning of the disciples in John 17:12-18

Then they were glad that the waters were quiet and He brought them to their desired haven (Ps 107:30) John 6:21 Then they were glad to take him into the boat, and immediately the boat was at the land to which they were going.

John's outline - Psalm 107 (30) ps 107:1-16- captivity (passover); 107:17-22- desert (manna); 107:23-33 (this event)

They were glad = they wanted Him - in contrast to the crowd Jn 6:25-26, main idea: your exodus from unbelief is a gift from God implication: darkness has not overcome- Jn 1:5 Application: Eph 5:8

Main Idea:

Your exodus from unbelief is a gift from God

Implication:

Darkness has not overcome it John 1:5

Application:

unbeliever:

Jesus came to them in the storm, He came to them from the darkness there is no problem too difficult - no sin too scandalous to keep God from saving you who will believe

believer:

no amount of unbelief can stop the gospel from doing its work remember it worked for you Eph 5:8 - it can work for anyone - so whats holding you back?
