## Problem:

we are already full - Jer 2:4-13; (zech 9:11) but our jars are leaking

## Text:

### The Gospel is God's Agenda

John 4:1 ¶ Now when Jesus learned that the Pharisees had heard that Jesus was making and baptizing more disciples than John John 4:2 (although Jesus himself did not baptize, but only his disciples),

- John 4:3 he left Judea and departed again for Galilee. (last we hear of the baptizer- John is emphasizing faith not ritual)
- John 4:4 And he had to pass through Samaria.

John 4:5 So he came to a town of Samaria called Sychar, near the field that Jacob had given to his son Joseph.

- John 4:6 Jacob's well was there; so Jesus, wearied as he was from his journey, was sitting beside the well. It was about the sixth hour. why are 4-5 significant? Samaria was not a geographical necessity for Jesus- it was on the Divine agenda
  - (4) had = dei same word translated must in 3:7, 14, 30 this trip was planned in the mind of God Jn 4:31-35 a model for evangelism
    (4) Samaria whats the point after Nicodemus? Luke 10:25-32 parallel theme used samaritan to scandalize self righteous jews

#### **For Whoever**

John 4:7 ¶ A woman from Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink."

John 4:8 (For his disciples had gone away into the city to buy food.)

John 4:9 The Samaritan woman said to him, "How is it that you, a Jew, ask for a drink from me, a woman of Samaria?" (For Jews have no dealings with Samaritans.)

John 4:10 Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God (but you don't - if is a second class conditional if which means contrary to fact), and who it is that is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water."

John 4:11 The woman said to him, "Sir, you have nothing to draw water with, and the well is deep. Where do you get that living water? John 4:12 Are you greater than our father Jacob? He gave us the well and drank from it himself, as did his sons and his livestock." John 4:13 Jesus said to her, "Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again,

John 4:14 but **whoever** drinks of the water that I will give him will never be thirsty again. The water that I will give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

John 4:15 The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water, so that I will not be thirsty or have to come here to draw water."

(9) 2 Kings 17:1-6, 24-41 - this is a people who are not worthy and everyone knows it - no boasting salvation is from the Lord Jn 1:12-13 - not born of blood, will of flesh or will of man but of God

### ls Thirsty

John 4:16 ¶ Jesus said to her, "Go, call your husband, and come here."

John 4:17 The woman answered him, "**I have no husband**." Jesus said to her, "You are right in saying, 'I have no husband'; John 4:18 for you have had five husbands, and the one you now have is not your husband. What you have said is true." John 4:19 The woman said to him, "**Sir, I perceive(t am perceiving- present) that you are a prophet**.

He did not make light of her sin -He pointed it out after she asked for the living water - she needed to know her place in the story just like nicodemus and the rich young ruler - Mark 2:15-17; Matt 5:6, 13 - make them thirsty

just what Jesus did 4:10 -> 1 Cor 2:1-16- the gospel not only quenches thirst it awakens it

### Are you thirsty?

John 4:20 Our fathers worshiped on this mountain (changing the subject), but you say that in Jerusalem is the place where people ought to worship."

John 4:21 Jesus said to her, "Woman, believe me, the hour is coming when neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem will you worship the Father.

John 4:22 You worship what you do not know; we worship what we know, for salvation is from the Jews.

John 4:23 But the hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father is seeking such people to worship him.

John 4:24 God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth."

John 4:25 The woman said to him, "I know that Messiah is coming (he who is called Christ). When he comes, he will tell us all things."

#### John 4:26 Jesus said to her, "I who speak to you am (he)."

(20,25) who is legit? whoever is thirsty
(23) who is He seeking
(Isaiah 2:6-22) - God hates the proud -cant see past their mountain, temple, pedigree worship self righteously Ik 18:9-14 - self righteous - opposite of spirit and truth
(23) spirit and truth - 1 Jn 1:5-10 humble repentance always begins with thirst/need - Isaiah 55:1-2 -EVERYONE who thirsts -sees spiritual need can come (14) rev 22:1,17 -John 7:37-39 - if anyone is thirsty- such people
(26) come - ego eime- I myself and no one but me will satisfy your thirst- (exodus 3:13-14); (John 1:1-4, 14, 18)

Main Idea:

Whoever is thirsty, come

# Implication/application: this passage is a model for evangelism - John 4:35

- (1-6) we can be motivated by His sovereignty
  - accept it may not look like you think
- (7-15) we can initiate a gospel witness with any person (whoever)
  - you don't need to become muslim to share the gospel with muslims etc.
- (16-19) we must remember that the good news is only good if you know you need it - remember Barabbas
- (20-25) we can't get sidetracked by religious debate with the lost
- speak truth but keep driving to the gospel for it is the power of God for salvation (26) what you call them with is what you call them to
  - remember He is the good news, not self improvement not your best life now
